NADIA



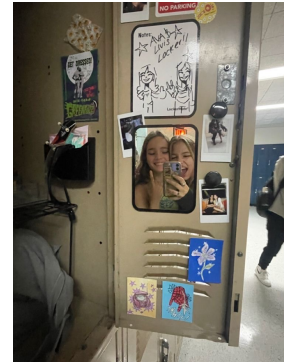
Two things describe her: always late and always chaotic. She means well but can't seem to get her life together. She's also dating Katherine's ex... which definitely isn't awkward. Not at all!

BRYCE

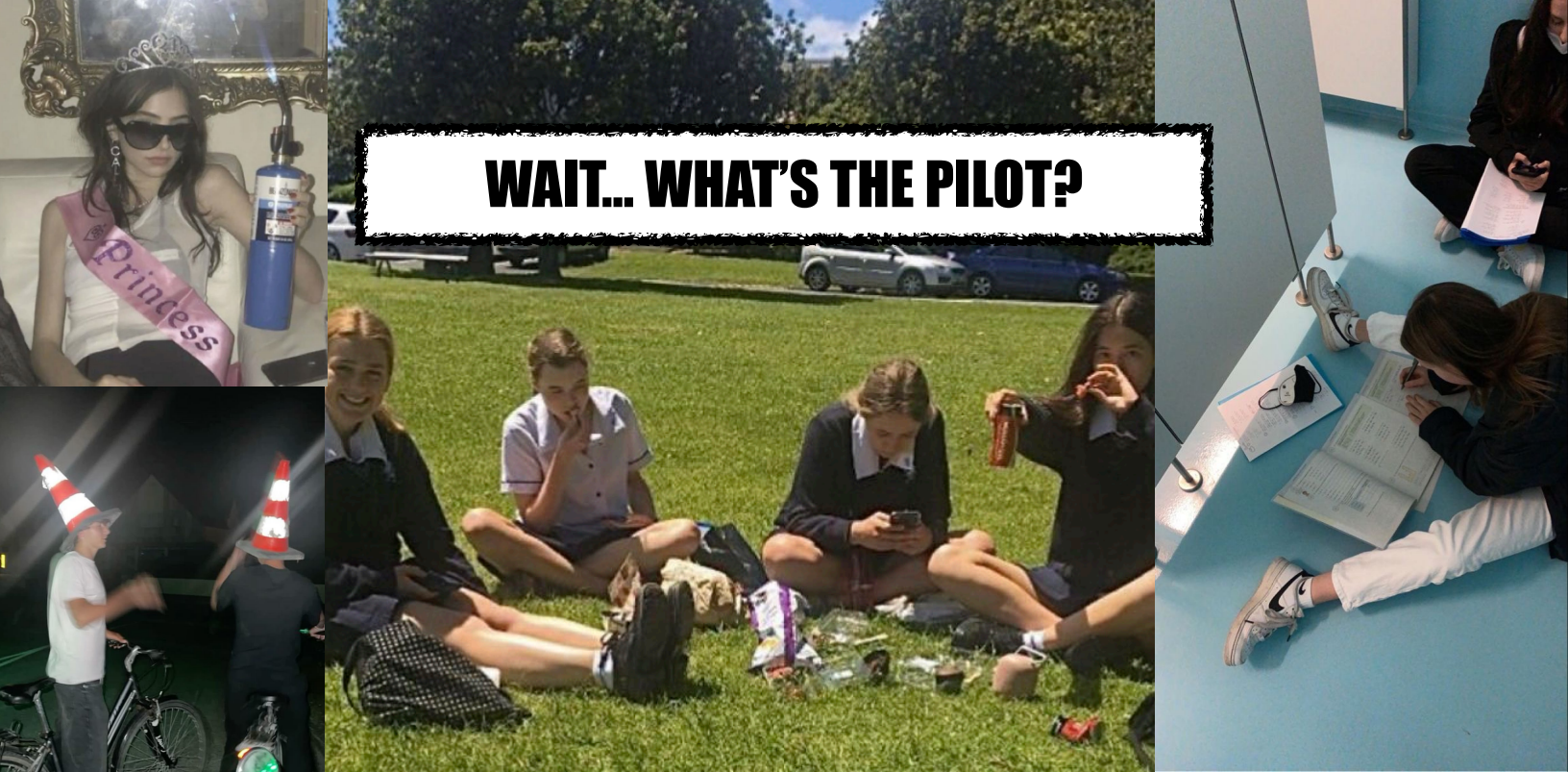


Katherine's ex and Nadia's current boyfriend, but he doesn't see any issue with it! He's charming, good-looking, and somehow oblivious to the tension he causes.

WAIT... WHAT'S THE PILOT?

Dog Days dives into how every single day of high school is either the best or worst of your life. In the pilot episode, we meet Katherine, our main character, as she tries to survive a classic day of sophomore year... you know, the kind where there's a mandatory drug search and you're forced into close proximity with your best friend and ex-boyfriend, who just so happen to be dating. It happens to the best of us!

The episode begins with Katherine breaking the fourth wall to give us an unfiltered tour of Hillsborough High, a private school that's as chaotic as it is pretentious. We learn that the only thing she loves about the school is her friend group, which keeps her going. There's Courtney, the overachiever; Victoria, an athlete on scholarship; and Nadia, who's perpetually late and always a little out of the loop.

Just when the day seems like another regular, mildly terrible one, the intercom blares. The school's headmaster, Mr. Plummer, announces a mandatory drug search, locking all the students in the gym. Cue both the baseball and lacrosse teams gagging and calling their parents to come get them: "Mom, they're doing drugs here!" Meanwhile, Katherine and her above-it-all group stay calm, what's the worst that can happen? They find some baby Tylenol? However, the calm doesn't last long once Bryce and James call them for help with a very gross and illegal problem. Only they would stumble upon a clogged toilet with an overflowing cocktail of drugs.

The girls, ever the problem solvers and team players, agree to help. There's just one problem: who the hell knows how to unclog a toilet without their maid around? Thanks to Victoria's real-life skills (and no thanks to James' accidental mustard gas), they finally manage to clean up the mess before the drug-sniffing dogs find them. However, of course, that doesn't happen without one final unthinkable act: James having to hide his vape where the sun doesn't shine.

It's messy, it's weird, and it's just another day surviving the dog days of high school.

UHH WHY WATCH THO?



If you survived high school (or are still enduring it), *Dog Days* speaks your language. Despite the show taking place in Tampa, Florida, awkward crushes and questionable teachers are a universal experience. The show perfectly captures the chaos, drama, and weirdness of teenage life. You have to laugh because if you don't, you'll cry.

It also gives a fresh take on the world of high school comedy. Forget jocks versus nerds—Hillsborough High is a private school where the swim team reigns supreme (by default), the headmaster makes everyone do turtle hand signs, and Murphy's Law reigns supreme: if something can go wrong... it probably will! Also, don't look to the teachers and staff for guidance; they're just as eccentric, if not more so. Mr. Plummer, the headmaster, is trying, and royally failing, to keep the school under control and maintain its pre-Ivy League image. In contrast, Mrs. Duffy is a relic from another era who doesn't really care if she sends children home with the homework assignment, "Ask your parents if they've attended an orgy."

However, the place seems a little more tolerable when you've got friends like Katherine's. Each of the girls has something you've seen in your own friends, whether you like it or not. First, there's our protagonist, Katherine. She treats school like a reality show she's stuck in, she's over the nonsense but too curious to fully check out. Then, there's Courtney, who sees high school as a mere stepping stone into the world of the Ivies. She's going to be Valedictorian even if it means blackmailing the headmaster. Meanwhile, Victoria thinks the whole place is a joke but maintains a realistic outlook while dying from secondhand stupidity. Finally, Nadia can barely make it through the day without being late or confused... school is a challenge she's not winning.

It's important to note that the world of the show isn't your typical high school location. There's no small-town diner or iconic skyline *but* there are alligators in the parking lot and Florida men hanging outside your school gates. The weirdness of Florida, especially Tampa, adds an unpredictable, chaotic energy that fits perfectly with the offbeat tone of the show. Additionally, it gives insight into a private school that doesn't fit into the stereotypical elite world. With a school attended by Florida girls and boys, the show can lean into Florida's anything-can-happen reputation, making whatever ridiculous situations arise feel believable.



OKAY BUT THEN WHAT HAPPENS...

The first season of *Dog Days* will focus on the girls' sophomore year with each episode blending high school mishaps and unexpected chaos into the already messy nature of teenage life. The world of the show will primarily follow the four girls, plus Bryce and James, both on and off campus.

POTENTIAL EPISODES:

Homecoming Hustle

With Homecoming fast approaching, the girls, minus Nadia, are in a panic over whether to wait for the guys to ask or take matters into their own hands. Katherine decides to take a bold step and ask Ryan to the dance, only to suffer a painfully awkward setback. Meanwhile, James is caught in a dilemma, unable to choose between three girls to take. In a desperate attempt, he puts them all into a group chat to let them decide for him.

The Sound of Envy

It's time for the annual German Exchange Program, and both Katherine and Bryce have decided to host a student this year. Katherine's student, Hans, is determined to live out his dream of becoming an American cowboy, but Katherine is unsure how to make that happen. Meanwhile, Bryce is paired with Anna, a stunning blonde girl, but things quickly take a turn when Nadia grows suspicious of her. Convinced that Anna might be hiding a secret, Nadia embarks on a mission to prove she's a "secret Nazi," putting the entire group on edge.

To Err is Human, To Arr is Pirate

The group heads to Bryce's uncle's mansion on Bayshore for the annual Gasparilla Day Parade, eager to throw an epic party. But things quickly spiral out of control when uninvited guests show up, costumes get ruined, and old tensions between friends resurface. As the night unfolds, the mansion fills with a growing number of drunk pirates, each more rowdy than the last. The chaos escalates, leading everyone to ask, how many drunk pirates are too many? The party goes from festive to full-blown disaster, leaving the group scrambling to salvage what's left of their celebration.

Pisgah: Nature's Flaw

It's the annual sophomore field trip to Pisgah National Forest, and as usual, chaos follows the group. Katherine is stuck in a group with Bryce, where old feelings resurface, leading to awkward tensions and unresolved issues. Meanwhile, Nadia and Victoria are convinced a bear is stalking their group. James' feelings for Courtney come to a head when he flirts with another girl in an attempt to make Courtney jealous, only complicating things further. As the group navigates their way through the wilderness, personal drama takes center stage in the middle of the great outdoors.

Hot or Not?

In the season finale, an anonymous senior releases a list ranking all the girls and guys at school based on "hotness," sparking chaos. The girls are determined to find out who created it, all while subtly debating whether the rankings are accurate. James and Bryce are equally curious, but for a different reason: James can't understand why he's ranked so low and is obsessed with uncovering the culprit. The episode culminates in a series of surprising confessions. Katherine finally opens up to Ryan about her feelings, only to be shocked when he doesn't immediately reject her. Meanwhile, Bryce, feeling the pressure, admits he still has feelings for Katherine. The tension builds as the group is left wondering what will happen when the truth comes out.
